Did you know?

- The sex industry is estimated to be a \$99 billion dollar industry worldwide and holds more people captive than the transatlantic slave trade. Organizations exist to serve those who seek to escape, and can also provide resources to help build awareness and provide opportunities for others to join in responding to this outrage. - Porn has become common place and its consumption directly feeds the sex industry. According to the Barna Group's research two out of three youth pastors and more than half of senior pastors say porn is a current or past struggle (barna.com/the-porn-phenomenon).
- According to the Association of Sites Advocating Child Protection, \$3 billion dollars
 of revenue come directly from child pornography (asacp.org).
- HopeFortheSold.org, an organization that has created a documentary called
 Over18, states that about 85% of boys under 14 years old have seen pornography.

What can we do?
