

# WORKING TOGETHER AS ONE BODY

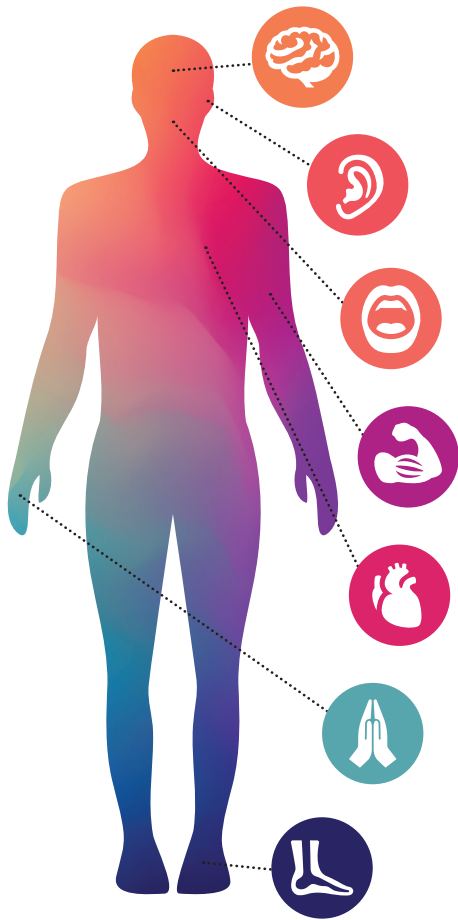


“... in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.” Romans 12:4-8
